Pacificans Care Provides Emergency Fund Grants to Local Agencies

The Pacifica community has rallied to support the Pacificans Care Emergency Fund, established to address the needs of Pacifica's core social service agencies in the event of a major disaster that interrupts normal day to day activities of Pacificans for a prolonged period of time. To address current emergency needs Pacificans Care recently provided a

total of \$18,000 in emergency grants to the Pacifica Resource Center, Pacifica Senior Services, and the Jefferson Union High School District Student Assistance program. The Pacificans Care emergency grant to Pacifica Senior Services is now helping to serve up to 200 Grab and Go lunches a day to seniors who pick up, what may be their substantial meal of the day, from the center. The Pacificans Care emergency grant to the Pacifica Resource Center is covering installation costs for a container-size refrigerator unit to store produce and grocery items for food deliveries to over 200 Pacifica families and emergency rental or mortgage assistance to families in need as a result of job loss. 130 Pacifica high school students are receiving breakfast and lunch Jefferson Union High School District Student Assistance Program through the Pacificans Care emergency grant. Summary of PPCA Meeting Minutes—April 16, 2020

Meeting was called to order on April 16 at 7:39 pm. an online meeting. Online meeting attendees were: Helen Bronte-Stewart, Sam Casillas, Cherie Chan, Danny Estrella, Bruce Ferry, Robert Vercoe, Joanne Gold, Camille Keating, Robert, Marcia Settel and Allison West were present. The minutes of the Jan. 16, 2020 meeting were approved.

Treasurer's Report

The treasurer's report of the Balance Sheet, Income & Expenses through March 31, 2020 was submitted and approved.

- a. Total Current Assets = \$62,880. However, we will need to return a substantial amount of deposits due to events being cancelled due to COVID-19.
- b. Due to the ongoing amount of work, we now have a bookkeeper, so being treasurer is going to be less labor-intensive moving forward.
- c. We will set up an offline committee to look into Venmo and other opportunities to accept
- d. We're taking a major hit for the foreseeable future, as large-scale events are unlikely during COVID.

Events Committee Report

- a. Progressive dinner will be moved to some point in the future.
- b. Need to start thinking of other revenue concepts. Perhaps schedule a May meeting to consider some kind of summer event?

Firehouse Maintenance Report

- a. Several critical infrastructure issues were being planned for this year, which are being tabled due to COVID-19.
- b. Julian has been using Borate-based pesticide to treat for powder beetles.
- c. Julian is also retrofitting the post and beams for earthquakes.
- d. Danny Has updated bids for re-siding the firehouse (all walls except north-facing stucco)
 - i. Hearty cement-based siding \$80,000
 - ii. Louisiana Pacific has wood-looking siding. \$88,000
 - iii. Not including additional repair work or electrical
- e. Marcia will look into working with Pacifica Historical Society: we have shared interests, and may be able to look into laying the groundwork


