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Hwy 1 Bridge Replacement Project

Pedro Point residents learned at a February 19 meeting organized by CalTrans that the agency will close Highway 1 from San Pedro Terrace to Linda Mar Blvd. from April 2014 to October 2015, while the bridge across San Pedro Creek is rebuilt. During the construction, traffic between Pacifica and Montara will be diverted along the section of San Pedro Avenue that runs parallel to Highway 1 in front of the Pedro Point Shopping Center.

CalTrans is undertaking the \$17.5million project in order to bring the bridge, which is now below flood zone elevation, up to current seismic and structural standards. The new bridge will accommodate the enormous

water flow that theoretically occurs once in a hundred years.

A focus of the Feb. 19 meeting was the project's

impact on traffic to and from Pedro Point and the Pedro Point Shopping Center. While Highway 1 is closed, CalTrans will install a traffic light in front of the Ace Hardware store, at the intersection where traffic from Montara will enter San Pedro Avenue. CalTrans calculates that the detour will add only 30 seconds to most trips. Even during the morning and evening rush hours, Caltrans says the delays will be only a few minutes. Also, cars exiting the shopping center from either of the driveways at the



front of the shopping center will not be allowed to turn left; all cars leaving the shopping center bound for Linda Mar and points north will have to exit using the driveways on the south side of the shopping center. Pedro Point residents attending the meeting voiced concern and skepticism about CalTrans' projected 30-second delays. Highway 1 at Linda Mar is currently two lanes in each direction, but the new traffi

each direction, but the new traffic light at the hardware store will have only one lane in each direction for Highway-One traffic. Fewer lanes means delays could be longer than 30 seconds.

People also voiced concern about all northbound traffic from the shopping center exiting from the south-side exits from the parking lot. Visibility is poor from those driveways, and those cars would add to the

> traffic back-up exiting Pedro Point at the hardware store traffic light. But perhaps the biggest concern voiced at the meeting was that the project was being presented to the

public as a *fait accompli*, with no opportunity for modification to meet the public's concerns. "When were the public meetings on this project held?" somebody asked. After consultation among themselves, CalTrans and City officials agreed that public hearings were, indeed, held - years and years ago. In fact, most of the public hearings took place before the Pedro Point Shopping Center was as vibrant as it is today, and before many current Point residents even lived here. During the weeks following the February CalTrans meeting, several discussions about avoiding future repetitions of this disconnect have occurred between Point residents and members of City Council. Mary Ann Nihart and Karen Ervin have been responsive. We are working with them to find a way to facilitate communication between Pedro Point and the City, but as of this writing no viable mechanism has been identified.

This is the third installment of Steve Brown's Flashback Jam. Steve has put together another great film from his vast video

archives of rock music that features some fun outdoor reggae, Zero in the Park, Sundogs at Slim's, Jerry Garcia and Bob Weir acoustic. The Surf Coasters (hard driving Japanese surf rockers) shred a couple, Bonnie Raitt and Grace Slick do their



thing, Punk Rockers at Mabuhay Gardens, more from Roy Rogers, CSN&Y, Little Feat, The Band, Bill Graham, Terry Dolan, John Cipollina and the Grateful Dead. As a member of the Grateful Dead's management team Steve has captured very special moments of some of rock's great artists. THE FIREHOUSE FILM SERIES PROUDLY PRESENTS "THE NATURAL ART" SURF FILM BY FRED WINDISCH

BY DANNY ESTRELLA A remarkable artist and filmmaker, Fred Windisch celebrated the art of surfing with his creativity and inventive spirit. The photographs he began capturing at the age of 18, offer a rare and personal glimpse into what life was like as the sport was just beginning to take off in San Francisco, Pacifica, Santa Cruz and Oregon. His photographs, years ahead of their time, capture more than a sport—they capture a way of life.

Fred turned to film making and documented the short board revolution in the late 1960s. His film, *The Natural Art*, was released in 1969. Featured surfers include Ben Aipa, Jackie Baxter, Tiger Espere, Dick Keating, Jim Lucas, John Scott, Tim Watts, performing innovative surfing and experimenting with innovative board shapes (early short board shapes, primitive wood surfboards in the West Indies, finless boards, a surfboard



controlled by a rudder and steering wheel). It was filmed on location at Haleiwa (Hawaii), The Ranch (Southern California), West Indies, Secos (Southern California), San Francisco Ocean Beach, Monterey, Fort Point, Deadman's (San Francisco), and Davenport, California. Influenced by Fillmore Auditorium's rock concert light shows, Fred brought the light show effect to The Natural Art using images of clouds. The film explores technical developments with references to outer space, including space ships and flying saucers. It dives into personal growth and inner

space, exploring freedom of dance and the sense of community in free-for-all dancing at outdoor rock concerts, as well as yoga, martial arts and skiing. The wipeout sequences playfully bring out the sexiness of surfing. Fred's eye for the beauty of nature is brought out in the nature scenes of snow-capped mountains, lakes, colorful clouds at sunset and peaceful meadows. Fred's sense of whimsy is carried throughout the film.

The film cleverly draws from a broad range of musical styles with soundtrack transitions from folk rock boogie, to bluegrass, Indian ragas, 60s psychedelic rock, to African drumming, symphonic music, pop soul, to classical guitar, to Bach played on Moog synthesizer, to Chicago blues, to traditional surf music. The world was filled with social, artistic and technical experiments in the late 60s. Fred captured that spirit and

60s. Fred captured that spirit and added his own contributions through his experimental and artistic filming techniques. Fred incorporated his artistic sensibilities into the film, making *The Natural Art* much more than a surf film. One message from the film could be Fred saying that it's not just surfing that's a natural art. Everything in life is. **Check your inbox for a screening date announcement. We anticipate showing it sometime in May.**

PPCA Board Meeting Minutes—Jan. 16, 2014

Meeting was called to order on 1/16/14 at 7:35 pm. Board Present: Bruce Ferry, Danny Estrella, Joanne Gold, Tony Brockman, Robin Jaquith, Sam Casillas, Marcia Settel Absent: Breck Hitz and Michael Martin 1. The meeting opened with a presentation on home security from Pete Olinger, a volunteer with the Pacifica Police Department Crime Prevention Unit. Mr. Olinger handed out "Site Security Audit Forms" on which we could evaluate our neighborhood safety issues. He also distributed a "Home Security Checklist" to assess our own homes for safety issues. Although the focus of his presentation was crime prevention, he suggested that these assessments can also be of value in home emergency situations, such as isolation in a tsunami. 2. The minutes of the previous meeting were not approved as there was no quorum from that meeting. The unapproved minutes are part of the record.

3. A new Board and Officers were seated. As there were fewer than 12 nominees, and no contested officers, no election was necessary. The Board members are: Joanne Gold, President

4. There was no treasurer's report but it was reported that rental income is up. However, our insurance rates have increased by \$600 a year. Other insurance agents have been contacted to see if a better quote can be found. There was discussion about how to increase our rental income, such as raising rates or more variation based on time of event. A subcommittee to review rental rates were appointed. Members are Camille, Danny, Tony and Claire.

5. Firehouse Committee—Danny reported that no major firehouse repair or renovation had occurred in the quarter. A ceiling mount for a projector had just been purchased so as to enable easier showing of films. The next film to be shown is another Flashback Jam on April 20. There was discussion of remodeling the downstairs area to have indoor birthday party space and an ADA compliant bathroom. A capital campaign would be needed to raise the fund for long-term improvements. A Firehouse Committee consisting of Danny and Andy was established; it was suggested that both John Peterson and Mike Panesi would be good members as they have construction skills.

6. The Annual Chili Cook-Off is scheduled for August 24th. The Progressive Dinner is scheduled for April 26th if there is enough interest. Other possible events include a garage sale, maybe the same week end as the Alma Heights sale, and an art show.

The Devils Slide County Park just opened in March and already the Pedro Point Headlands have seen an increase in hikers. The Headlands stewardship team under the direction of the Pacifica Land Trust through a grant by the Coastal Conservancy has been preparing for this moment for a long time. Not only have they made many trail improvements, they have installed trail signs at all of the strategic intersections to guide these visitors safely to and from the ocean vistas. A new trail was even built above the old Green Gate entrance location so that visitors can park in the Devils Slide County Park parking lots on the north end and walk into the headlands via a paved trail. A welcome sign was recently installed. This trail is for pedestrians only as it is not suitable for bikes. A future bike path to Pacifica is planned for this site.

Other News Recently, groups of enthusiasts enjoyed the Charlie Brown Tree and Plant a Native event, bird hike, and SOS watering events to help the plants make it through the drought. The last work team discovered a rare San Francisco dusky woodrat nest near a newly discovered and deeply hidden slide area that was covered in pampas grass. There is always something to do and wonderful people to work with so if you have any interest in the headlands we invite you to join us.
