the water is reaching. We all know that our water levels are rising, irrespective of the wave action of a winter storm. We may not agree about the best long-range strategy for dealing with this issue, but as our recent local election showed, the issue of sea-level rise is a hot button issue that cannot be environmentally, economically or politically ignored.

As a community that will be directly impacted by this rise, we know the

conversation is going on all the time, whether with our close neighbors or at citywide forums. Some of this discussion has to do with the empty field on San Pedro Ave. - the "Calson" property after the name of the owner. The question is whether the property's



potential environmental value as a wetlands basin to absorb water in the case of high water levels brought about by climate change outweighs its current economic value as a site for residential or commercial development. And if we, as a community think the answer is "yes," do we have the political will to do something about it?

The agenda for our next meeting on January 17th will include time for the conversation with the hopes of developing a work group to tackle the issue. So please come. And if you can't come but want to get involved, please get in touch.

Summary of PPCA Meeting Minutes—October 18, 2018

Meeting was called to order on Oct. 18 at 7:33pm. Board members present: Danny Estrella, Marcia Settel, Breck Hitz, Camille Keating, Allison West. A quorum was not established so no decisions were made. The minutes of the July 2018 meeting were not approved due to the lack of a quorum.

Treasurers Report

A full treasurer's report was not presented. In its place, Breck presented estimates of accrued interest and monthly payments for a loan that would pay for re-siding of the exterior of the Firehouse. This information will be used in discussions regarding financing of the proposed siding project, which has not yet been approved. Danny has obtained loan application forms from Tri-Counties Bank. Completion of the forms is pending.

Events Committee Report

Upcoming events include a showing of Elizabeth Pepin's film 'Super Stoked Surf Mamas of Pleasure Point' on Sunday November 4, Pub Night on Friday November 30, film event sometime in 2019, hosting the surf band The Mermen sometime in 2019, Potluck dinner in January or February 2019.

Elizabeth Pepin's film: Elizabeth will manage publicity and share door receipts with PPCA while PPCA will offer beverages.

Pub Night: Marcia will obtain the beer and wine sales permit, Danny will recruit local musicians, distribute flyers to Manor Music, Green Room music school, post notices on NextDoor and submit an article to the Pacifica Tribune to be included in the Community Events section. Anne will post notices on the PPCA MailChimp email distribution. The Mermen concert: Danny will coordinate a date for the Mermen concert.

Firehouse Maintenance Report

Firehouse Re-Siding Project: Peninsula Siding Company has submitted a bid in the amount of \$59,689.00 subject to certain options. Discussion has begun to look into taking a loan to finance the project. Danny has obtained loan application forms from Tri-Counties bank and will prepare them with the help of Breck, the PPCA Treasurer. Marcia will look into the need for business interruption insurance.

Julian has installed a new handrail on the deck stairs.
