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Operation Access a Success! by Danny Estrella

The renovation of the Firehouse restrooms is complete. Both the ladies' and men's restrooms now meet the ADA compliance code. The work required replacing the floor and ceiling joists as well as the wall that separates the rooms. There was minor rot in the exterior wall studs that was readily replaced with fresh wood. All new plumbing and electrical wiring were installed. New windows, doors, light fixtures, toilets, grab bars, sinks and mirrors were installed. It was a complete tear down and rebuild. It came out great. The special touches include the penny floors and brass porthole windows on the doors.

We took advantage of the down time during this work and repainted the interior hall. The painting was not part of the restroom renovation plans and was made possible through the generosity of an anonymous donor (thank you). This included patching the many pinholes, cracks and uneven surfaces. Hundreds of staples were removed from the walls and ceiling trusses as well as



tape that was used to support decorations during private parties. The room was painted in two tones of off white with pure white used on the trim. An added touch is a chair-rail trim that separates the lower walls from the upper walls. The total effect is a significant upgrade to the look and feel of the room: bright, classy and charming.

Many people came together to make all of this possible. Andy Anderson acted as the general contractor for the restroom renovation, coordinating the different teams doing carpentry, electrical, plumbing and the floor installation as well as managing the design plans and obtaining the necessary permits. John Peterson donated his time to install the electrical service. Much credit goes to Frank Lazzari, local contractor and foreman for Firehouse maintenance. Frank repaired the leak in the roof that has plagued the Firehouse for



a long time. He did the technical patching and 'mudding' of the walls during the preparation for painting. He provided valuable guidance to the volunteers during the preparation and painting phase. He came up with the idea to apply a texture to the walls for enhanced effect and applied this texturing (on his own) and cut, installed and painted the chair-rail trim (his idea, too). He also installed the coat hangers near the restrooms. Much gratitude is due to the volunteers who came out to patch, sand, tape, paint, sweep and clean up during the painting parties: Andy Narraway, Barbara Lubben, Breck Hitz, Bruce Ferry, Camille Keating, Cherie Chan (thanks for the banana nut bread and noodles), Daniel Kim, David Skadeland, Ed Gold, Gary Helmling, Greg Hirsch, Kathy Long, Hearty, Helen Bronte-Stewart, Joanne Gold (thanks for the Bloody Marys), Julian Brock, Marcia Settel, Robin Park, Sarah Jain, Shanna Yonenaka, Sherman Lee and Steve Jain. At times the work hustle resembled a team at a Los Angeles car wash. I cannot thank you enough. You're all magnificent. The Operation Access team coordinated the fund raising and event planning.

Thank you Anne Evers Hitz, Debbie Lynch, Joanne Gold, Kathleen Shugar, Kathy Long, and Marcia Settel. And, none of the restroom renovation could

have been done without the very generous donations of cash and goods from those who were able to make contributions. The Operation Access fundraising team wants to convey our deep gratitude for your participation.

I also want to thank Brad and Julie Wahrlich for their donation of the Weber BBQ grill to the Firehouse.

In addition, there is a continuing need to replace broken chairs and tables. Your donations to purchase new equipment are much appreciated and will be acknowledged.

Summary of PPCA Meeting Minutes Jan. 21, 2016

Individuals nominated to the Board of Directors for 2016-17:

Andy Anderson, Sam Casillas, Danny Estrella Bruce Ferry, Joanne Gold, Breck Hitz, Camille Keating Barbara Lubben, Andy Narraway, Marcia Settel By unanimous consent, all nominated individuals were named to the Board. The Board members nominated and approved the following officers for 2016-17: President: Danny Estrella

Vice President: Marcia Settel Treasurer: Bruce Ferry

Secretary: Breck Hitz

<u>Treasurer's Report</u>: Bruce reported that he was near the end of the complex, multi-year project to change the institution's official name from *Pedro Point Improvement Association* to *Pedro Point Community Association*. Even though we've been calling ourselves PPCA for many years, the official name registered with the state is "...Improvement...", that's the name on our bank

accounts, which causes confusion.

Bruce said that 2015 had seen a net gain in our liquid assets of about \$10,000, and our gross from rentals had been about \$44,000. A second checking account for the bathroom project had been established and about \$28,000 was transferred from the existing account to the new account. Together with about \$2,000 worth of restroom renovation bills already paid from the existing account, \$30,000 has been transferred from the PPCA treasury to the restroom project. The treasurer's report was unanimously approved.

Firehouse Committee: Danny reported that the restroom project was essentially on schedule, despite a few minor problems that Andy Anderson described. Andy added that these problems would not have significant impact on the project's cost, and that he was "on pace" to complete the project within the \$40-to-\$50k budget. Danny reported that enough penny tiles to cover the floors of both restrooms – 140 of them – had been assembled. Once the restrooms are completed, Danny wants to repaint the inside of the building. An anonymous donor has agreed to fund the cost of the painting supplies. As far as fundraising is concerned, Joanne reported that about \$17,000 had been raised from the community, including gifts from many Pedro Point residents. Events Committee Marcia reported that the kickoff for Operation Access (the restroom project) had been very successful, with a good turnout for both showings of the film about the Firehouse history. There will be a combined potluck and Grand Opening of the refurbished Firehouse, with the new restrooms, sometime in March or perhaps April. The committee plans for the annual Chili Cook-Off to return in the fall of 2016. Joanne has graciously offered to chair the event.

New Business

Gwen Holden proposed that a "Little Library" be installed at the Firehouse, and she offered to pay for it and maintain it once installed. Gwen's proposal was unanimously approved by the Board, and the Board expressed appreciation for her generosity.

Sam reported on the Land Trust's progress in restoring the Pedro Point Headlands. The existing motorcycle trails will be decommissioned, and new pedestrian trails will be constructed. The Headlands will eventually be turned over to San Mateo County. The Land Trust has several sources of funding, including \$1.1 million from the Off-Highway Motor Vehicle Recreation Division of California State Parks, and \$350,000 from San Mateo County Measure A.

The full Board minutes will be available after approval at the next PPCA Board meeting.

When Robin retired from a career as an elementary school principal in 2004, he was asked what are you going to do during your retirement? A friend at the San Francisco Giants suggested working at the ballpark. Twelve years later, Robin is still enjoying his work at the park as a Rapid Responder in Guest Services. His main responsibility as a Rapid Responder is to help guests enjoy their ballpark experience to the max. Rapid Responders address issues and handle altercations that come up such as obnoxious behavior, drunkenness, smoking and general questions. Fans can anonymously text their concerns to the number on the scoreboard. If a situation looks intense, Robin will call for backup. The park has a zero tolerance policy regarding bad behavior.



When he started, he assumed it was volunteer work but was pleased to hear it pays a little. The commitment is 30 games per season and he gets to choose the games he wants to work. He has worked some post-season games and the energy at the park is very different than during regular season games. Robin likes working for the SF Giants



because they treat the employees like family and are an equal opportunity employer—there is diversity and opportunity for differently-abled. The best part of the job, he says, is that "it's always a nice day and a good time at the ballpark." Robin also is a volunteer docent at SFMOMA and he and his wife Ginny like to travel and play golf at courses around the world. They have lived together on Pedro Point for 45 years, plus five more for Ginny.
